NDANO was founded in 1997 by nonprofit leaders who recognized the need to strengthen nonprofit organizations in North Dakota and their ability to serve the needs of individuals and communities.

NDANO is the statewide membership association for the North Dakota nonprofit sector. Our members work in all mission areas, from human services and the environment to education and the arts, and represent all sizes, from small volunteerrun nonprofits to multi-million-dollar organizations, in all corners of the state.

### **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

Educate: Multiple learning opportunities, sector news and best practice resources

- Held the annual Nonprofit Leadership Conference in Bismarck with 162 registered attendees.
- Shared more than 160 learning opportunities offered by NDANO and its partners, including NDANO's Comprehensive Webinar for 501(c)3 Sports Organizations – From Governance to Compliance and Intro to AI for Nonprofits Webinar in partnership with SCORE, to name a few.
- Provided technical assistance and referrals to members and potential members.
- Published the monthly Nonprofit Network newsletter and Learning Lookout and information via social media and email on nonprofit issues.

- Distributed the bi-monthly Nonprofit Advocacy Matters publication in partnership with the National Council of Nonprofits


Connect: A network of members across North Dakota and the United States

- Connected North Dakota nonprofits to national issues through membership in the National Council of Nonprofits, the largest network of charitable nonprofits in the nation.


## **FINANCIAL OVERVIEW:**
